Models

This instruction sheet describes installation of the:

- Universal Roller Bag, Part Number 98944-04
- Universal Side Loading Bag, Part Number 98945-04A
- Universal Deluxe Side Loading Roller Bag, Part Number 98949-06

See Table 1 for model-specific strap configuration information.

NOTE

Use caution when installing bags on seats with very thin and/or very narrow passenger pillions. Do not install if any portion of the bag contacts the rear fender. Contact with painted surfaces can scratch or scuff paint.

Do not install Roller Bags on models equipped with rear speakers. Damage to the speakers could result.

Additional Parts Required

The luggage listed in this instruction sheet requires the vehicle to be equipped with a passenger upright (sissybar), backrest pad and passenger pillion OR a Tour-Pak[®], passenger pillion and saddlebag guards.

Separate purchase of additional parts or accessories may be required for proper installation of this luggage on your model motorcycle. Refer to the latest Harley-Davidson Genuine Motor Accessories and Genuine Motor Parts catalog for a list of required parts or accessories for your model.

Kit Contents

These Bag Kits include four long mounting straps and four short mounting straps.

A mounting strap service kit (H-D Part Number 98948-04) is also available for purchase. That kit contains two long mounting straps and two short mounting straps.

INSTALLATION

A WARNING

See the Accessories and Cargo section in your owner's manual. Improper cargo loading or accessory installation can cause component failure and adversely affect stability, handling and performance, which could result in death or serious injury. (00021b)

- · Mount the bag on the passenger pillion only.
- Do not exceed 25 pounds (11.4 kg) total weight of bag, contents, and attachments.
- Secure the bag straps to the vehicle to prevent bag shifting during vehicle operation.
- Verify that straps do not obstruct reflectors, turn signals or tail lamp.
- Verify that all straps are secured to prevent strap contact with the rear wheel during vehicle operation.
- For the Universal Roller Bag and Deluxe Side-loading Roller Bag, the pull handle must be fully retracted before operating the vehicle.
- See the Owner's Manual for recommended tire inflation pressure.

A WARNING

Do not exceed the motorcycle's Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVWR) or Gross Axle Weight Rating (GAWR). Exceeding these weight ratings can lead to component failure and adversely affect stability, handling and performance, which could result in death or serious injury. (00016f)

- GVWR is the sum of the weight of the motorcycle, accessories, and the maximum weight of the rider, passenger and cargo that can be safely carried.
- GAWR is the maximum amount of weight that can be safely carried on one axle.
- GVWR and GAWR are shown on the information plate, located on the frame down tube.




Figure 1. Zippered Pocket and Backrest Mounting Buckles (Universal Roller Bag Shown)

Models with Passenger Uprights

- See Figure 1. Open the zippers (1) on the zippered pocket (2) on the rear of the bag. Unbuckle the backrest mounting buckles (3).
- 2. Position the bag over the passenger pillion with the zippered pocket facing the passenger upright. Slide the zippered pocket down over the passenger upright until the bag is sitting on the pillion.

NOTE

Do not install Roller Bags on models equipped with rear speakers. Damage to the speakers could result.

3. See Figure 2. Secure the backrest mounting buckles around the backrest and tighten. Tighten the side straps on either side of the backrest pad. Close the zippers on both sides of the pocket as far as they will go.

NOTE

Depending on the size of the backrest pad, the zippers may not close all the way. This is acceptable. The zipper pulls will remain locked in place no matter where they are positioned along the zipper track.

 See STRAP CONFIGURATIONS and Table 1 to select the appropriate straps and mounting configuration for the motorcycle being fitted. Attach the straps to the bottom mounting buckles on the bag.

NOTE

See Figure 3. The bottom mounting buckles (2) are stored inside zippered storage pockets (3) on the bottom of the Universal Roller Bag.




Figure 4. Mounting Strap and Strap Keeper

5. Secure the mounting straps according to the installation method recommended in Table 1 and the corresponding strap configuration photos. Tighten the mounting straps so the bag feels stable, with minimal movement on the vehicle. See Figure 4. Tuck excess strap material into the strap keeper (2) on each mounting strap (1).

NOTE

Ensure that excess strap material is securely tucked into the strap keeper on the strap to prevent it from contacting painted surfaces. Strap material contacting painted surfaces can scratch or scuff paint.


Models with Tour-Pak ${\ensuremath{\mathbb R}}$ and Saddlebag Guards

- 1. Place the bag on the passenger pillion with the zippered pocket facing the Tour-Pak[®].
- 2. See **STRAP CONFIGURATIONS** and Table 1 to select the appropriate straps and mounting configuration for the motorcycle being fitted. Attach the straps to the bottom mounting buckles and backrest mounting buckles on the bag.
- 3. Secure the mounting straps according to the installation method recommended in Table 1 and the corresponding strap configuration photos. Tighten the mounting straps so that the bag feels stable, with minimal movement on the vehicle. See Figure 4. Tuck excess strap material into the strap keeper (2) on each mounting strap (1).

NOTE

When installing a bag, avoid pinching or chafing wiring harnesses. The recommended method of routing a mounting strap to avoid damaging a nearby wiring harness is shown in Figure 5.

Ensure that excess strap material is securely tucked into the strap keeper on the strap to prevent it from contacting painted surfaces. Strap material contacting painted surfaces can scratch or scuff paint.

STRAP CONFIGURATIONS

Locate the strap configuration applicable to the model of motorcycle being fitted in Table 1 below and in the photos that follow.

NOTE

Four long and four short mounting straps are provided in each bag kit to accommodate a wide variety of vehicle configurations and mounting methods. Specific vehicle configurations may not require the use of all four straps.




Figure 7. Strap Configuration 2




Figure 9. Strap Configuration 4




Figure 10. Strap Configuration 5





Figure 13. Strap Configuration 8

RAIN COVER

Each bag is equipped with a built-in rain cover, enclosed in a zippered storage pocket.

1. See Figure 14. Unzip the storage pocket (1,3) and pull out the rain cover (2,4). Cover is attached to the pocket by a wide elastic strap.



- Storage Pocket: Universal Side Loading Bag and Deluxe Roller Bag Rain Cover: Universal Side Loading Bag and 1.
- 2. Deluxe Side Loading Roller Bag




Figure 15. Rain Cover Installed

2. See Figure 15. Unroll rain cover and pull down over travel bag. An elastic band sewn into the opening of the cover secures it snugly around the bottom of the travel bag.
